# Certified Parent Peer Specialists...

Along with the changes happening to the Certified Peer Specialist program in Wisconsin, the state is also leading the way in the nation with a Certified Parent Peer Specialist program. One of just a handful of states Wisconsin is excited to soon be able to offer Parent Peer Support to individuals in the role of parenting a child or youth identified with mental health and/or substance use concerns.

Expanding into the Certified Parent Peer Specialist (PPS) model has become a natural step for the continued growth in sustainable peer provided services in Wisconsin. The successes in the Certified Peer Specialist program have been recognized by many state leaders and in turn, we are looking forward to the same positive results for Family's. In having increased access to Certified Parent Peer Specialist, families will experience increased engagement, partnership and better outcomes when they are involved with Mental Health and/or Substance Use services in Wisconsin.

Focusing on family's resilience, increasing parent and youth involvement with services including the support of a parent peer that has "been there done that" is again at the core of this new certification. The key component to this new program is identifying how the Certified Parent Peer Specialist themselves were able to deal with their own feelings, emotions and successes around the multiple complexities of raising a child or youth identified with mental health and/or substance use concerns. The capacity to build that relationship by sharing similar experiences of parenting, modeling hope for a positive future and honoring choice has been proven to improve outcomes for everyone in recovery-oriented systems of care.

After significant work by many stakeholder groups and individuals already doing the work around the state, a new timeline has been published. With dedication, determination and continued engagement with the community, this timeline can be achieved and initial training for Certified Parent Peer Specialist is anticipated to begin in mid-2017. # 2017 Peer Specialist Training Curriculum, Certification Exam, Recertification


There are some exciting changes coming to the WI Certified Peer Specialist Program in 2017. There will be a new Peer Specialist Training Curriculum which integrates both Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder. This training will give potential Certified Peer Specialists an opportunity to broaden their scope of practice with the lived experience of either Mental Health, Substance Use Disorder or co-occurring. This curriculum will be the only one that qualifies people to take the WI Peer Specialist Certification exam. Twelve trainers have been selected to provide trainings around the State. Trainers will be in pairs with a balance of both Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder. (There are no further Peer Specialist trainings in 2016)

A new certification exam was written and validated in conjunction with the updated Core Competencies and training. The exam will continue to be multiple choice and proctored at the eight Independent Living Centers. The passing score for the exam will remain at 85%.

**Continuing Education requirements for recertification for 2017** will be updated to be more inclusive of Substance Use Disorder. Categories will include Cultural Humility, Ethics and Boundaries, Mental Health Specific, Substance Use Specific, Trauma Informed Care and Peer Specialist Specific.
