

Peer Support Facilitator Job Description:

The Center for Leadership of Afrikan Women's Wellness (CLAWW) seeks Certified Peer Specialists (CPS) to provide group facilitation services to our Sister's Talk Healing Circles.

Our mission is to increase awareness and develop a network of services and circles of individualized support for Black/African American women affected by trauma in Milwaukee County.

The Peer Support Facilitator is responsible for engaging peers in meeting individuals where they are, helping them discover their potential, providing a sense of belonging and support, and empowering them to obtain their goals.

The goal is to promote Physical, Emotional, Mental, and Spiritual wellness while enhancing the skills and ability of peers to meet their chosen goals in a non-judgmental manner through small group sessions virtually and in person. This position focuses on providing support based on shared experiences to empower women with mental health, trauma, and substance abuse using a person-centered approach. Peers provide support, strength, and hope.

Responsibilities:

- Provide Sister Talks healing circle facilitation.
- Provide peer support for persons with mental illness, trauma, and substance abuse.
- Establish rapport with peers; share life experiences to assist persons with changing patterns and behaviors in a culturally competent and sensitive manner.
- Model effective coping techniques and self-help strategies based on the specialist's recovery experience.
- Support women in advocating for themselves while maintaining the confidentiality
- Provide information and resources.
- Consistent attendance at Peer Specialist meetings, events, and required training.
- Provide attendance data and contact information for participants. Complete and submit the required documentation to the CEO by the due date.
- Work collaboratively with individual team members
- Perform other duties as assigned

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree preferred but will accept High school diploma
- Wisconsin Peer Specialist Certification
- Lived experience, personal experience with Black women in recovery, and knowledge of recovery Principles.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- Basic computer skills are a must
- Valid Driver's License and ability to provide current car insurance
